BB to train up 10,200 to create new entrepreneurs

Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr Atiur Rahman has said the central bank is going to trained about 10, 200 people next three years to fill up skill gap in Small and Medium Enterprise (SME) sector and create new entrepreneurs. Of the total trainees, 40 per cent trainees will be selected from women, people with disabilities, ethnic minority and indigenous people.

The governor disclosed this while addressing a discussion on Financial Inclusion Literacy for Strengthening Entrepreneurial Capacity held at Westin Hotel in the city Wednesday.

"SME has experienced a tremendous development in Bangladesh over the last 5 years, which has created a skill gap", he said.

A project titled "Skills for Employment Investment Program (SEIP)", assisted by Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) has been taken in this regard.

Under this project, he explained, the training programmes would create soft skills, up-skill and employment generation skill in 5 fields- IT, garments, light engineering, industrial electrical maintenance etc. through 8 (eight) outsourcing of skill training providers.

The outsourced firms will be responsible for at least 70% or more job placement after the training.
